

CHAINS

From this corner, the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 31, bears east, 13.84 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 1 in. in diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within this township is nearly level to rolling land and is located in Paradise Valley. The base of the Santa Rosa Range of mountains extends into sections 6, 7, and 18. The soil varies from sandy clay in the nearly level valley to sandy clay and rocky on the rolling land. The area drains southeast into the valley and thence southerly.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and a large amount of hay is grown on the private land in the eastern part of the township.

Access into the township is provided by State Highway 8B, which bears northeast through the township, and other improved and trail roads.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
