	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	The land surveyed within this township is nearly level to gently rolling and is located in Paradise Valley. The soil varies from sandy clay on the nearly level land to sandy clay with gravel and rock on the western part of the valley. The area drains southeast into the valley and then southerly.
	There is no timber. The principal users of the area are cattlemen and a considerable amount of hay is grown on the private lands. Access into the township is provided by State Highway 8B which bears northerly through the township and other improved and trail roads.
	No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
