GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 44 North, Range 42 East, is gently rolling to rolling desert land, ranging in elevation from about 5500 to 6400 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy loam along the river to sandy clay loam, gravelly and rocky. The only timber is scattered willows along the river. The undergrowth consists of sagebrush, shadscale, budsage and sparse native grasses.

The North Fork Little Humboldt River crosses the township draining the area except for the northeast portion which drains into the Little Owyhee River and the southwest portion that drains into Martin Creek. Springs are located in secs. 1, 31 and along the line between secs. 8 and 9. Nevada Northern Gas. Co. pipeline crosses the township. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by desert roads. There is no settlement within the township.
