T. 40 N., R. 54 E., MDM, NEVADA

## CHAINS

- N. 0° 09' W., along line 5-6, Tract No. 42.
- 1.80 Trail road, bears E. and W.
- 13.40 Mahala Creek, 15 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course E.
- 25.44 Intersect the S. bdy. of sec. 21, at a point from which the W. 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 21 and 28, bears S. 88° 48' E., 5.045 chs. dist.
- 39.82 Point for AP 6, Tract No. 42, identical with the CW 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 21, as surveyed by U.S. Deputy Surveyor H.B. Maxson.
- Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land in the portion of the township resurveyed is rolling, draining easterly into the North Fork of the Humboldt River. The soil is clay loam and gravel. The vegetation is mostly sagebrush and bunchgrass. There is no timber.

Principal use of the township is cattle grazing.

No mineral formations were noted during the course of the survey.

There are no settlements in the township.
