Undergrowth, sagebrush and bunchgrass.</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land in the portion of the township resurveyed varies from rolling to level irrigated meadow land. The soil is clay loam and gravel, the meadow land is sandy silt.</p> <p>The vegetation consists of sagebrush and bunchgrass with native hay grasses in the meadows. There is no timber.</p> <p>The township has a plentiful water supply from Pratt and Foreman Creeks which drain southeasterly through the township to the North Fork of the Humboldt River.</p> <p>The principal uses of the township are cattle grazing and raising of native hay.</p> <p>No mineral formations were noted during the course of the survey.</p>
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
