Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
U. S. Deputy Surveyors A. J. Hatch and J. H. Eaton
in 1870.

The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on the S. bdy. of the
Tp., monumented with a wooden post, 1 in. square, broken
in pieces and loosely set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 20 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

35.70 Graded road, bears NNE. and SSW.; enter bottom land.

40.37 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 34, at propor-
tionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the
original corner.

in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
