


DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE WEST BOUNDARY, T. 16 N., R. 61 E.


raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, E. of cor.

N. 0° 20' E., beginning new measurement.

Over slightly rolling land, through medium heavy undergrowth.

34.42 Point for the 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 1, T. 16 N., R. 60 E., at 80.00 chs., northing from the cor. of secs. 1 and 12.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.



deposit broken glass around the iron post, 6 ins. below the surface of the ground.

40.59 The cor. of Tps. 16 and 17 N., Rs. 60 and 61 E., monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the final returns of the Independent Resurvey of the East Boundary, T. 17 N., R. 60 E., under Group 409, Nevada.

Land, slightly rolling.  
Soil, sandy and gravelly clay loam.  
Timber, none; undergrowth, sagebrush, black brush, rabbit brush and some greasewood and shadscale.

From the standard cor. of Tp. 16 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E., marked, set and witnessed as described in the official records.

N. 0° 57' W., along the E. bdy. of sec. 36, T. 16 N., R. 59 E.

Over gently rolling valley land of Jake's Valley, through low underbrush.

40.02 The 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 36, only, monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., marked, set and witnessed as described in the official record.
