GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township is located in Penoyer Valley, about 60 miles northwest of Alamo, Nevada.

The portion of the township resurveyed is mostly rich valley land. The soil consists mostly of a sandy loam with some rocky clay soil found on the slopes.

The vegetation consists of greasewood, shadscale, creosote brush and bunch grass providing winter range for cattle. There is no timber.

Water is supplied from wells throughout the township.

No mineral was noted when surveyed.

There are no settlements in the township.
