Land, rolling to mountainous.
Soil, sandy loam, gravelly and rocky.
Undergrowth, sagebrush.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The general elevation of this township ranges from about 4,375 to 5,650 ft. above sea level. Most of the township is nearly level to gently rolling desert land. The northwestern part is rolling and low mountainous. The soil varies from sandy, clay and alkaline to sandy loam and alkaline on the lower elevations to sandy loam, gravel and rocky on the higher elevations. The area drains southerly toward the Humboldt River:

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access to the township is provided by State Highway No. 18 and other improved and unimproved roads. There is one spring located in section 14 and a well, with windmill, located in section 28.

There has been some prospecting for gold and silver in sections 5 and 6.
