Re-establishment of a Portion of the Survey  
Executed by A. J. Hatch, Deputy Surveyor, in 1868.

The cor. of Tps. 36 and 37 N., Rs. 43 and 44 E., monumented with a squared wooden post, 2x2x36 ins., loosely set in a mound of earth and evidence of the original pits.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

reset the wooden post alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, S. of cor.

N. 0° 02' W., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over gently rolling land, through medium undergrowth.

39.87 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
