	From the corner of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the S. bdy. of the Tp., an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the resurvey of T. 37 N., R. 42 E.	
	N. 1° 18' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36.	
	Over nearly level land, through medium undergrowth.	
40.80	The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with a squared wooden post, 2x2x36 ins. long, mkd. ¼ S. and loosely set in a mound of earth.	
	At the corner point	
	Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.	
	T38N R42E S 35 S 36 1964
