CHAINS GENERAL DESCRIPTION The general elevation of T.~3~N.,~R.~46~E. ranges from about 5,700 ft. to about 7,200 ft. above sea level. The Saulsbury wash is located in the central portion of the township. The land is principally rolling with the higher elevation being in the eastern portion. The soil is a mixture of sand and clay; the eastern portion is somewhat stony. U. S. Highway No. 6 enters the township on the west boundary near the corner of sections 7, 12, 13 and 18, traversing the township and leaving on the east boundary near the corner of sections 7, 12, 13 and 18. A telephone line parallels the highway through the township. There is no timber in the township of commercial value. The vegetation consists chiefly of scrub sage and native bunch grasses of medium growth along the washes, In other areas of the township, the vegetation is scattered.
