

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, SUBDIVISIONAL LINES, T. 8 N., R. 42 E.

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The general elevation of T. 8 N., R. 42 E., ranges from about 5,700 ft. to about 7,500 ft. above sea level. The soil is a mixture of sand and clay, the west and northern portions being in the higher elevation is somewhat stony.

There are a number of improved and unimproved roads that traverse throughout the township, the principle of these is the Peavine Road that enters the township on the east boundary near the cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, traversing through Peavine Canyon and leaving on the north boundary and west of the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33.

There is a small stream of water in Peavine Creek which flows the hear around, and is used for irrigation by the Bertolinos and Peavine Ranches which are located approximately in secs. 4, 9, and 16. A reservoir located in secs. 11 and 14 is used for the watering of range stock and some irrigational purposes.

The timber consists of scattered juniper and pinon along the northern portion of the township, but is of no commercial value. The chief vegetation is mainly scrub sage and salt brush. Some grasses of medium growth are found along the washes.
