bury the remains of the original corner monument, a squared wooden post, alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, S. of cor.

From this corner, the standard cor. of secs. 34 and 35, T. 21 N., R. 63 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set in the ground, marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of the concurrent Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Fourth Standard Parallel North, (South Bdy., T. 21 N., R. 63 E.), bears N. 89° 59' W., 25.92 chs. dist.

From this same corner, the standard ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 35, T. 21 N., R. 63 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set in the ground, marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of the concurrent Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Fourth Standard Parallel North, (South Bdy., T. 21 N., R. 63 E.), bears S. 89° 59' E., 14.37 chs. dist.

The original closing corner of secs. 1 and 6, monumented with the remains of a squared wooden post, badly decayed, with illegible markings, loosely set in the ground, alongside a copperweld post. The copperweld post is firmly set in the ground with a mound of stone to the south. I mark the copperweld cap AM. This closing corner was monumented and the position determined as latitude 39° 38' 12.343" N. and longitude 114° 49' 22.723" W. under Grp. No. 389, Nevada.

Land, nearly level.
Soil, sandy and gravelly clay loam.
Timber, none; undergrowth, sagebrush and rabbit brush.
