

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE S. BDY., T. 19 N., R. 63 E.

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The general elevation of the lines surveyed is approximately 6100 to 6500 ft. above sea level. The eastern and northern portion is nearly level land, while the southern portion is gently rolling.

The majority of the land in the township is mostly good meadow land and this is watered by a number of small sloughs. The water from Duck Creek flows into the township and forms Bassett Lake, a fairly large body of water, which is located in the southwest portion of section 35. A portion of this water flows north through the township where some of it spreads out into tule swamps.

The Nevada Northern railroad traverses from south to north through the eastern portion of the township. There are a few settlers living in the township who have fields under cultivation and irrigation.

There are some improved roads that traverse from south to north through the township. At the present time, the majority of the township is used for livestock grazing. The mountains rise steep along the west side of the township and they are covered with a good stand of small timber.
