CHAINS

bury the remains of the squared wooden post alongside the iron post, and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2½ ft. high, N. of cor.

bury the corner stone alongside the iron post, and raise a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 3 ft. high, W. of cor.

This cor. was found under Grp. No. 389 and was made a BLM Tellerometer triangulation station. The geographic position of this corner is latitude 39° 43' 29.090" N. and longitude 114° 49' 40.781" W.

Land, slightly rolling.
Soil, sandy and gravelly clay loam.
Timber, none; undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood, and rabbit brush.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 21 North, Range 63 East, is nearly level land in the eastern portion and is rough mountainous land in the western portion. The elevation of the township ranges from about 5,900 feet to 8,500 feet above sea level in the north central portion.

The greater part of the township is located in the Egan range of mountains and the drainage flows into Duck Creek located in the Steptoe valley for the eastern portion of the township.

The soil varies from sandy and gravelly alkaline clay loam in the valley lands to sandy and gravelly, stony in the Egan range.

The vegetation consists of native grasses along the waterways with a medium heavy growth of undergrowth throughout the area.
