GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 23 North, Range 63 East is nearly all level valley land located in the northern portion of Steptoe Valley which lies between the Schell Creek and Cherry Creek ranges of mountains. The elevation ranges from approximately 5700 feet to 6100 feet above sea level.

The soil varies from a sandy and gravelly alkaline clay loam in the valley to a sandy and gravelly soil along the base of the Cherry Creek range along the western portion of the township.

The vegetation consists of a fairly good growth of native grasses along the waterways with a fairly heavy growth of sagebrush, rabbit brush, and greasewood.

The township is drained by Duck Creek which flows northerly through the township. The principal users of the township are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by an improved oiled highway which traverses from east to west across the northern portion and by a graded road which traverses from the south to the north through the western portion of the township. The Nevada Northern Railroad also traverses through the eastern portion of the township from south to north.
