No. 389.</p> <p>Land, nearly level. Soil, sandy and gravelly alkaline clay loam. Timber, none; undergrowth, sagebrush and rabbit brush.</p> <div>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</div> <p>The land within Township 24 North, Range 63 East, is nearly level land, and is located in the northern portion of Steptoe Valley between the Egan and Schell Creek ranges of mountains. The elevation ranges from about 5900 to 6100 feet above sea level. The soil varies from sandy and gravelly along the Egan mountain range to sandy and gravelly alkaline clay loam in the valley land. There is no timber in the township. The vegetation consists of native grasses along the drainages with sagebrush and rabbit brush throughout the area.</p> <p>The township is drained by Duck Creek which flows northerly across the township. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by desert roads.</p>
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
