N. 88° 21' W., beginning new measurement.

Over nearly level land.

- 2.20 Track road, bears NE. and SW.
- 3.71 The $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. of sec. 3 only, hereinafter described.
- 17.00 Leave brush, enter emergency air strip, 1.65 chs. wide, about 40 chs. long, bears N. 82° W., and S. 82° E.
- 32.00 Leave emergency air strip, enter medium dense brush.
- 39.78 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 35, monumented with remains of a badly deteriorated wooden post, loosely set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground and in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.

S. 89° 46' W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 36.

Desc. 200 ft. over steep W. slope, through medium dense timber.
