

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, W. BDY., T. 15 N., R. 38 E.

CHAINS

The standard 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 16 N., R. 38 E., heretofore described, bears N. 89° 50' E., 22.69 chs. dist.

Land, mountainous.
Soil, stony and sandy clay.
Timber, medium dense pinon and juniper.
Undergrowth, sage, bitter brush and bunch grasses.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, SUBDIVISIONAL LINES, T. 15 N., R. 38 E.

Re-establishment of the survey executed by Stewart and Morrison, Deputy Surveyors, in 1883.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the south boundary of the township.

N. 0° 12' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

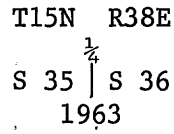
Over low rolling land covered with sage and salt brush.

Ascend 30 ft. over a gentle S. slope.

17.00 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains WSW.

39.57 Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

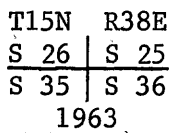


Ascend 130 ft. over a S. slope.

66.70 Crest of spur, slopes SW.; desc. 130 ft. over a NW. slope.

79.14 Point for the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 16 ins. in the ground and in a mound of stone, 3 1/2 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.



Land, rolling.
Soil, sandy clay.
Undergrowth, sage and salt brush.

From the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, on the E. bdy. of the Tp.
