DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE NORTH BOUNDARY OF T. 16 N.,
R. 39 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Re-establishment of the Survey Executed by Barker and McClellan, Deputy Surveyors, in 1879 and the west three miles resurveyed by Andrew Nelson, U.S. Transitman, in 1915

Beginning at the corner of Tps. 16 and 17 N., Rs. 39 and 40 E.

Point for the cor. of Tps. 16 and 17 N., Rs. 39 and 40 E., at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground; and in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.

The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, T. 16 N., R. 39 and 40 E., monumented with a squared wooden post, set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears S. 0° 46' E., 80.32 chs. dist.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground and in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground and in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.
