

SURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES, COMPLETING
THE SUBDIVISION OF T. 17 N., R. 39 E., MDM., NEVADA

CHAINS

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 32, heretofore described,
bears S. $88^{\circ} 59' W.$, 4.24 chs. dist.

The cor. of secs. 32 and 33, heretofore described,
bears N. $88^{\circ} 59' E.$, 35.01 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The township is located on the eastern slope of the
Desatoya Mountains and along the west side of Smith
Creek Valley, about 30 miles WSW. of Austin, Nevada.

The elevation of the township varies from 6,000 ft. to
8,000 ft. above sea level. The soil is a mixture of
sand and clay loam in the mountainous portion, and
varies to alkaline clay on the dry lake bed in the
southeast corner of the township.

There is an improved gravel road that traverses the
township, entering on the south boundary of section 33
and leaving on the north boundary of sections 2 and 3.

The timber consists of pinon pine and juniper scattered
in the western portion of the area, and is of little
commercial value. Vegetation consists chiefly of sage-
brush, shadscale, rabbit brush and bunch grasses, and
near the dry lake bed, salt grass.

No significant mineral deposits were noted.

A 4,500 ft. emergency air strip is located in sections
11 and 14.

A natural hot springs area is located near the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec.
cor. of secs. 25 and 26. There are numerous small
springs of little flow and the water is near boiling
temperature.

There are no settlers in the township.
