## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The township is located in Butte Valley, about 20 miles west of Currie, Nevada.

The land varies from a rolling valley to the rough mountains in the south part of the township.

The soil consists of a gravelly loam in the valley to a shallow rocky clay in the mountains. The vegetation is mostly sagebrush, greasewood and bunchgrass providing grazing for cattle and sheep. There is some native hay and alfalfa grown in the eastern portion.

The timber consists of juniper and pinon of little commercial value.
