

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, T. 27 N., R. 62 E.

CHAINS

The following field notes are those of a dependent resurvey of the north, south, east and west boundaries and subdivisional lines of T. 27 N., R. 62 E., Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada.

Boundaries and subdivisional lines were surveyed by Preble and Thorburn in 1881 and 1882. The resurvey was requested by the State Director to provide identification of the boundaries of public land to facilitate administration under the appropriate land laws.

Before restoring the corners, the lines of the original survey were retraced and diligent search made for any evidence of the original corners and other calls of the original field note record.

The rules of proportionate measurements were applied in order to ascertain the position of lost corners after completing the necessary retracements to connect with the identified corner locations. In order to simplify the record, the true line notes only are supplied herewith, which refer to the completed resurvey.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1947, and the Special Instructions dated August 19, 1963.

The direction of the lines of this survey was determined by altitude observations on the sun. The lines were carried forward by sustained angulation being supplemented by other altitude observations on the sun taken throughout the progress of the survey. The verticle angles of measurements made on the slope were ascertained by a clinometer in good adjustment; the horizontal equivalents only are entered in the field notes.

The geographic position for the southeast corner of the township is at latitude 40° 09' 57.63" N., and longitude 114° 55' 16.75" W., as adjusted along section lines from Station ELA 014 of the Nevada Planning Department of the Nevada Highway Department, located in sec. 13 of T. 26 N., R. 61 E. Station was tied into under surveys of Group 425, Nevada.

The magnetic declination was read at a number of stations throughout the township and the average of these readings was found to be 16° East.

The cor. of Tps. 27 and 28 N., Rs. 62 and 63 E., monumented with a limestone, 18x16x10 ins., plainly mkd. and firmly set.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 8 ins. in the ground and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.
