	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within Township 19 North, Range 48 East, ranges from 6,300 to 6,700 ft. above sea level, and is rolling to nearly level. The soil is sandy clay loam. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale and some bunchgrass.</p> <p>One well was noted in the township named Woods Well No. 1. It was in operation and used principally for watering livestock. Some creeks provide water for livestock in the early spring but dry up during hot weather. No other springs were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by U. S. Highway No. 50 which crosses the southern portion of the township and good county roads. There are no settlements within the township.</p>
