CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 17 North, Range 47 East, ranges from about 6,400 to 6,700 feet above sea level, and is nearly level to rolling. The soil is sandy clay loam to light gravel. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale and sparse native grasses. No woodland types occur in the area.

The township is drained by Stoneberger Creek, which crosses through the western portion of the township. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen, and access into the township is provided by good county roads.
