GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 18½ North, Range 47 East, ranges from about 6,300 to 7,100 ft. above sea level and is located in Monitor Valley, the western portion of the township extending to Hickison Summit. The soil is sandy clay and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and shadscale. Crested wheatgrass is found in sections 6 and 7, which is included in the Hickison Summit Resource Conservation Area.

The only water noted throughout the township is a well in the NW. portion of section 8. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by U. S. Highway No. 50 and good county roads.
