## CHAINS

Land, gentle rolling.  
Soil, sandy clay.  
Undergrowth, sagebrush.

N. 89° 53' W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 31.

Over gentle rolling land draining S., through medium undergrowth.

37.86 The  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. of sec. 6, T. 21 N., R. 49 E., hereinafter described.

40.16 The  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, monumented with a wooden post, set loosely in mound of earth and dimly mkd. This cor. will now refer to the  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 22 N., R. 49 E., only.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

bury the original wooden post, alongside of the iron post and raise a mound of stone,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base, 2 ft. high, N. of corner.

N. 89° 49' W., beginning new measurement.

21.80 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains S.

33.40 Trail road, bears NNE. and SSW.

40.12 The cor. of Tps. 21 and 22 N., Rs. 48 and 49 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the survey of T. 21 N., R. 48 E.
