

## SUBDIVISION OF T. 20 N., R. 48 E.

## CHAINS

The point for the N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 6 is at 40.00 chains departure from the closing corner of secs. 5 and 6, and on the N. bdy. of the Tp.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

The standard cor. of secs. 31 and 32, T. 21 N., R. 48 E., heretofore described, bears EAST, 10.95 chs. dist.

The standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 21 N., R. 48 E., monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., set, mkd., and witnessed as described in the official record, bears WEST, 29.05 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 20 North, Range 48 East, ranges from about 6,000 to 8,000 ft. above sea level, and is rolling and mountainous. The soil is sandy clay and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and bunchgrass.

There were a number of small streams of water draining into the township from the Simpson Park Mountains which provide water for livestock in the area. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen, and access into the township is provided by good desert roads. There are no settlements within the township.
