Over rolling mountainous land; asc. 350 ft. over a broken S. slope to ¼ sec. cor.

39.94 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.
