Land, rolling mountainous. Soil, sandy and gravelly clay loam. Timber, pinon and juniper. Over rolling mountainous land; desc. 190 ft. over a NE. slope. 14.50 Trail road, bears NE. and SW. 16.00 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 4 ft. deep, drains SW.; asc. 300 ft. to sec. cor. 40.00 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
