The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the dependent resurvey of the S. bdy., T. 13 N., R. 64 E., executed concurrently under this same group.

Land, gently rolling.

Soil, sandy and gravelly clay loam.

Timber, pinon and juniper.

Undergrowth, sagebrush.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 12 North, Range 64 East, lies in the southern portion of Steptoe Valley and ranges from about 6,800 to 9,000 ft. above sea level. The township is covered with cedar and juniper timber.

The soil is a sandy and gravelly clay loam. Vegetation consists of sagebrush, mountain mahogany and a fair growth of native grasses along the main water courses. In the southern portion of Steptoe Valley a considerable portion has been seeded to crested wheat grass. Several springs have been developed. Wells have been drilled. The principal users of the area are cattlemen.

Access into the township is provided by a well maintained road that is located in the western portion of the township. There are no settlements within the township. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
