GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 14 North, Range 64 East, is nearly level to rolling. The elevation ranges from about 6,600 to 7,000 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay to sandy gravel. The timber is composed of scattered juniper along the west and east boundaries of the township. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, rabbitbrush, whitesage and crested wheat grass.

Most of the township is drained by Willow Creek, which is dry throughout most of the year. A well in sec. 36 is used for stock watering.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by U. S. Highway Nos. 6, 50 and 93, which runs through the NE. corner of the township, and Cave Valley Road, gravel, which runs through the west tier of sections, and numerous truck and trail roads.
