

EIGHTH STANDARD PARALLEL NORTH, R. 40 E.

CHAINS

- 40.10 Point for the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
- Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
- SC

- 1965
- set a steel fence post, N. of cor.
- 47.70 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains S.
- 53.10 Cor. of fence; fence, bears S. and W. along line.
- 80.19 The standard cor. of T. 41 N., Rs. 39 and 40 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record of the 1962 resurvey of the Eighth Standard Parallel North, through R. 39 E., executed under Group No. 402.
- Land, nearly level.
Soil, sandy loam.
Undergrowth, native grasses and willows.

Reestablishment of the Survey
executed by William Epler,
Deputy Surveyor, in 1867. The
description of the original
corner monuments found on this
line are described herein and
will now serve as Angle Points.

The original corner of Tps. 39 and 40 N., Rs. 40 and
41 E., set by William Epler in 1867, monumented with
a stone, 12x10x6 ins. above ground, mkd. with 6
notches on the N., E., S. and W. faces, with a mound
of stone W. of cor. This corner becomes an amended
monument and the stone is marked AM.

N. $89^{\circ} 54'$ W., on true line.

Over rolling land; desc. 50 ft. over SW. slope.
