

SUBDIVISION OF T. 40 N., R. 41 E.

CHAINS

The standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 32, T. 41 N., R. 41 E., bears S. $89^{\circ} 57'$ E., 23.93 chs. dist.

The point for the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6 is 40.00 chs. in departure from the closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6 and on the Eighth Standard Parallel North.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to cap, 4 ft. base, with brass cap mkd.

The standard cor. of T. 41 N., Rs. 40 and 41 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the concurrent resurvey of the Eighth Standard Parallel North, through R. 41 E., bears S. $88^{\circ} 11'$ W., 16.32 chs. dist.

The standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 41 N., R. 41 E., bears N. $88^{\circ} 11'$ E., 22.48 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 40 North, Range 41 East, varies from nearly level in the eastern portion to rolling in the western portion. The elevation ranges from about 4500 to 5700 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy loam, rocky in the western portion. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, budsage and sparse native grasses.

The township drains East and North towards the Little Humboldt River. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by desert roads.
