GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
The land within Township 42 North, Range 41 East, is mountainous in the northwestern and southeastern portions and rolling in the remaining portion. The elevation ranges from about 4800 to 6000 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy loam; rocky in the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, budsage and sparse native grasses.	
The northern portion of the township is drained by Martin Creek which crosses secs. 5, 6, and 7. The southeastern portion is drained by Spring Creek which crosses secs. 25, 26, 34, and 35. The southwestern portion drains southwesterly towards the Little Humboldt River. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.	
Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by desert roads.
