The vertical angles of measurements made on the slope were ascertained by a clinometer in good adjustment; the horizontal equivalent only are entered in the field notes.</p> <p>The geographic position for the southeast corner of the township is at latitude 41° 12' 27.6" N. and longitude 117° 10' 50.4" W. as adjusted along section lines from tie to Getchel Mine Stack, located in section 33, with position published by USC&GS.</p> <p>The magnetic declination was read at a number of stations throughout the township and the average of these readings was found to be 17 3/4° East.</p>
