GENERAL DESCRIPTION		
<p>A considerable variety of land is found in Township 39 North, Range 42 East. The elevation varies from about 4500 to 7430 ft. above sea level. The Osgood Mountains extends into the western portion of the township. The central and northeast part is high rolling hills and the southeast and northwest portion is gently rolling. The soil varies from sandy loam on the lower elevations to sandy clay loam and rocky on the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, budsage, greasewood, bunch grass and cheat grass. There is no timber.</p> <p>The Osgood Mountains and range of hills divide the drainage southeast and northwest into the valleys. There are two springs in secs. 18 and 29, used for stock watering.</p> <p>The most important developments at the present time are the gold and silver-bearing open pit mines in sec. 33 and at the cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33 by Getchell Mines, Inc., with smelter and houses in sec. 33 and houses in sec. 28. Other users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by a graded gravel road bearing northerly to Getchell and other unimproved desert roads.</p>
