CHAINS

bury the original cornerstone alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

N. 0° 55' E., beginning new measurement.

Over rolling land.

0.50 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, drains N. 70° W.; asc. 40 ft. over a S. slope.

8.60 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 110 ft. over a NW. slope.

16.10 Kelly Creek, 30 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course S. 60° W.; asc. 120 ft. over a S. slope.

32.30 Trail road, bears E. and W.; asc. 30 ft. over a S. slope.

39.53 The cor. of Tps. 39 and 40 N., Rs. 43 and 44 E., monumented with a stone, 30x16x4 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, with steel fence post alongside and mkd. with 6 notches on the E., W., N. and S. faces.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
