CHAINS

Point for the W $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 19, is at midpoint and on the W. bdy. of the Tp.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 24, T. 17 N., R. 31 E., bears N. 0° 07' W., 1.08 chs. distance, heretofore described.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land surveyed within Township 17 North, Range 32 East, ranges from about 4,000 to 5,300 ft. above sea level and is nearly level to mountainous. The soil is sandy, silt and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, greasewood and bunchgrass.

Sand Mountain which consists of pure white sand is located in the central portion of the sections surveyed and is several hundred feet above the surrounding land.

There are two wells located in the SW. portinn of sec. 32 and one well in the NE. quarter of section 30.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and some tourists who are attracted by the sand mountain. Access into the area is provided by desert roads and U. S. Highway No. 50.

There are no settlers in the township.
