

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, FIFTH STANDARD PARALLEL NORTH, R. 60 E.

CHAINS

A juniper, 7 ins. diam., bears N. $74\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 221 lks. dist., mkd. T26N R60E S 31 SC BT.

A juniper, 6 ins. diam., bears N. $22\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 115 lks. dist., mkd. S 36 SC BT.

Bury the original wooden post alongside the iron post.

Land, low mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay and gravelly.

Timber, scattered juniper, and pinon.

Undergrowth, sagebrush.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE EAST BDY. OF T. 26 N., R. 60 E.
MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Re-establishment of the Survey Executed by
Preble and Thorburn, Deputy Surveyors, in 1881

Beginning at the Standard Cor. of Tp. 26 N., Rs. 60 and 61 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., set, mkd., and witnessed as described in the field notes of the concurrent resurvey of T. 26 N., R. 61 E.

N. $0^{\circ} 04'$ E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling land through medium undergrowth; desc. 50 ft. over a gentle N. slope.

40.235 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to underlying rock and in a mound of stone, $3\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

50.00 Leave scattered timber, bears E. and W.

55.00 Bottom of swale, drains E.

58.50 Desert road, bears SW. and E.; asc. 40 ft. over a SW. slope.

80.47 Point for the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
