

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, SUBDIVISIONAL LINES, T. 26 N., R. 60 E.

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 26 North, Range 60 East, is rolling and mountainous. The North, West, and Northeast portion is mountainous and covered with heavy juniper and scattered pinon. The elevation ranges from about 6300 to 7300 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam on the lower elevations to gravelly and rocky on the mountainous. The vegetation consists mainly of sagebrush in the lower elevations and desert grasses on the mountain slopes. An area in the central portion is being reseeded with crested wheat grass.

The township is located at the northern end of Long Valley. Most of the township drains into Long Valley which drains south. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are sheepmen and cattlemen and access into the township is provided by desert roads.
