

SURVEY OF T. 11 N., R. 57 E.

CHAINS

From this corner the $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1, T. 11 N., R. 56 E., bears N. $0^{\circ} 14'$ E., 3.62 chs. dist.

From this same corner the cor. of secs. 1 and 12, T. 11 N., R. 56 E., bears S. $0^{\circ} 14'$ W., 36.34 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 11 North, Range 57 East, is gently rolling to mountainous. The northeastern portion of sec. 1 is mountainous. The elevations ranges from about 5000 to 6300 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay on the lower elevations to gravelly and rocky on the mountains. The timber is composed of scattered pinon and juniper on the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and greasewood.

The Bull Creek Well NO. 1 is located in sec. 9. Most of the township is drained South by two main washes known as Duckwater and Bull Creeks, in the West tier of sections. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by Nevada State Highway No. 20.
