True point for the  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. of sec. 6 is on the E. bdy. of T. 12 N., R. 56 E. and at 40.00 chs. latitude from the closing cor. of secs. 6 and 7, falls in a wash, 30 lks. wide, 4 ft. deep, draining SSE. The witness cor., bears S.  $0^{\circ} 43' E.$ , 0.91 chs. dist.

The  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. of sec. 1, T. 12 N., R. 56 E., bears N.  $0^{\circ} 43' W.$ , 10.52 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

The cor. of secs. 1 and 12, T. 12 N., R. 56 E., heretofore described, bears S.  $0^{\circ} 43' E.$ , 29.67 chs. dist.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Township 12 North, Range 57 East, is located in Railroad Valley and the land is nearly level to rolling. The elevation ranges from about 5100 to 6300 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy clay and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and greasewood.

The township is drained by Broom Canyon, which drains southwest through the southern part of the township and Bull Creek, which drains south through the west tier of sections. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Nevada Highway No. 20 crosses the southwest corner of section 31.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by desert roads. There are no settlements within the township.
