

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, S. BDY., T. 34 N., R. 37 E.

CHAINS

Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey
Executed by W. Epler, U. S. Deputy Surveyor,
in 1867

Beginning at the cor. of Tps. 33 and 34 N., Rs. 37 and 38 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 34 N., R. 38 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group.

S. 89° 42' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over nearly level desert land, through medium undergrowth.

40.01 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, monumented with an unmarked deteriorated juniper post, 2 ins. square, 12 ins. long, firmly set in the ground and exposed 1 in. above ground level.

At the corner point.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in ground, with brass cap mkd.
