<p>CHAINS</p> <p>65.70</p> <p>78.40</p> <p>82.39</p>	<p>Desc. 330 ft. along a rolling E. slope, changing to NE. slope.</p> <p>Shallow ravine, drains NE.; leave scattered juniper; desc. 100 ft. over NE. slope.</p> <p>Shallow ravine, drains NE.; over rolling N. slope.</p> <p>The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 35 N., R. 37 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group.</p> <p>Land, mountainous to rolling. Soil, sandy loam and rocky. Undergrowth, sagebrush and June grass. Timber, scattered juniper.</p>	
	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>Township 34 North, Range 37 East, is situated about 12 miles southwest of Winnemucca, Nevada. The eastern four tiers of sections are located in Grass Valley and the western two tiers lie in the East Range Mountains.</p> <p>Access to the area is provided by a gravel road traversing the center of the township from north to south and numerous supplementary trail roads.</p> <p>The soil is generally sandy and alkaline clay in the valley and sandy loam in the mountains. There are scattered juniper trees along the mountainous portion and dense low sagebrush covers the majority of the area.</p> <p>The township is drained by Clear Creek which drains northerly through the township. There are water wells used for cattle and irrigation purposes in sections 4, 22, 23 and 26. Numerous mining prospects are located along the East Range Mountains.</p> <p>There is farming activity in sections 4, 23, 26 and 32. One family lives in section 32.</p>
