

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, T. 36 N., R. 37 E.

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 36 North, Range 37 East, is rolling in the northern portion, mountainous in the eastern portion which covers Winnemucca Mountain to nearly level bottom land in the extreme southern portion. The elevation ranges from about 4300 to 6600 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy on the lower elevations to sandy loam and rocky on the mountain. There are scattered willows along the Humboldt River. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, shadscale, budsage and sparse native grasses.

The township is drained by the Humboldt River which crosses the southeast portion of the township. There has been considerable mining activity in secs. 6 and 7 and on Winnemucca Mountain but none of the developments are operating at the present time.

There are a few settlers located in the southeast portion of the township. Access into the township is provided by the Jungo road and numerous trail roads. The Western Pacific Railroad crosses the extreme south portion of the township.
