

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, E. BDY., T. 34 N., R. 38 E.

CHAINS
 14.10 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 190 ft. over a N. slope to canyon bottom.
 16.00 Enter dense thicket, bearing E. and W.
 23.40 Sonoma Canyon, 5 lks. wide, 5 ins. deep, course WSW., cottonwood trees along creek. Asc. 20 ft. over a gentle S. slope.
 25.00 Leave dense trees and undergrowth along creek, bears E. and W.; enter sagebrush. Asc. 100 ft. over a SSE. slope.
 30.70 Enter dense chokecherry thicket, bears SE. and NW.; asc. 110 ft. over a ESE. slope.
 36.20 Ravine, drains S. 10° E.; asc. 130 ft. over a broken S. slope through dense chokecherry.
 40.84 Intersect the S. bdy. of sec. 36, T. 35 N., R. 38 E.
 Point for the closing cor. of T. 34 N., Rs. 38 and 39 E.
 Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., on bedrock and in a mound of stone, 3½ ft. base to cap, with brass cap mkd.

The original closing corner, monumented with a quartzite stone, 16 x 14 x 8 ins., firmly set in a collar of stone and plainly mkd. as described in the official record, bears N. 0° 10' W., 0.15 chs. dist. I mark the corner stone with an 'X', and added the letters AM and rehabilitate the collar of stone.

The cor. of T. 35 N., Rs. 38 and 39 E., described in the field notes of T. 35 N., R. 38 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group, bears N. 89° 44' E., 6.94 chs. dist.
