CHAINS

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

reset the remains of the original wooden post alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2½ ft. high, W. of cor.

N 0° 23' E., beginning new measurement.

Over nearly level desert land draining W., through medium undergrowth.

The cor. of Tps. 34 and 35 N., Rs. 37 and 38 E., monumented with a pine stake, 1 x 2 inx., 14 ins. long, firmly set in the ground on W. side of a railroad tie, 8 ins. square, exposed 5½ ft. above ground. This point is locally recognized as the corner and is accepted as the best remaining evidence of the position of the original corner.
