

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 35 N., R. 38 E.

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

A considerable variety of land and soil is found in Township 35 North, Range 38 East. The elevation varies from about 4,300 to 8,000 ft. above sea level. The Sonoma Mountain Range runs through the East portion, the central portion is rolling to gently rolling and the western portion is nearly level.

The soil consists of sandy loam in the lower elevation to sandy clay and rocky in the higher elevations.

The vegetation on the lower elevations consists mostly of sage brush and on the higher elevations sagebrush, native grasses, scattered juniper and along Water Canyon and Thomas Creek scattered cottonwood trees.

The township is drained by Water Canyon, which drains through sections 2, 3, 11, 12 and 13, and Thomas Creek, winding through the middle of the township on a westerly course.

There is some cultivated land in sections 16 and 31.

The principal users within the township are cattlemen and farmers; at the time of this survey there was no mineral activity of consequence.

Access into the township is provided by Grass Valley Road and other improved and unimproved roads. The Southern Pacific Railroad crosses through section 6.
